- 3. Engage students in video analysis using strategic questioning techniques.

Outline

With our societies becoming increasingly heterogeneous, occupational therapy practitioners need to be able to navigate the diverse backgrounds and contexts of our clients. Video analysis offers a way for students to appreciate different philosophies, share their own experiences, and reflect on culturally responsive practices. Furthermore, in-class discussions support students to be engaged learners and co-creators of knowledge and identity (Androsov & Zhang, 2023). This workshop will include didactic components, teaching through modeling, video watching, and interactive activities (discussions, handson work). Presenters will highlight cross-cultural comparisons of pediatric development as applied to pediatric occupational therapy practice. Participants will be able to implement video analysis and strategic questioning techniques in their practice to foster culturally responsive practitioners.
